<b>Curriculum:</b>	<b>CIVIL LAW AND CONSTITUTIONAL LEGALITY</b>
<b>Learning objective</b>	<p><b>“Person and market”</b> Acquisition of critical analysis and interpretation skill oriented to reconsider the private law issues in the context of the human being. In so doing, the market forces (originated by the economic initiative) will be well understood and balanced, in a way that globalization will not undermine the real value of the person.</p>

The analysis of market function (that is supposed to derive from the same values that from the inside bind the initiative freedom, by legitimate it as power of constitutional relevance) will be the key to get a better understanding of relationships between person and market.</p>
<b>Learning objective</b>	<p><b>CONTRACTUAL PRINCIPLES IN INTERNATIONAL TRADE</b>  Acquisition of expertise on international trade transactions, with specific technical skills of writing a contract. Ability to use the technique of dépeçage so as to respect the principles and values of the international community.</p>

The development of trade between individuals from different countries makes it important to know the sources of law not just national, but also abroad. To find the solution of the case will require the development of hermeneutical methods attentive to community sources and international and wise use of contractual principles. The research will cover the principles, model laws and uniform contractual rules enacted by such organizations as the International Chamber of Commerce, the UNCITRAL e l'UNIDROIT.</p>
