Degree Course Presentation

The purpose of this course is to develop strong interdisciplinary skills in key areas of socio-political science. In particular, it provides in-depth guidelines in the areas described below related to socio-economic relations in the public sector, policies regarding work and geographical territory, and international policies and the European Union.

Professional Opportunities for Graduates

The course provides the skills and abilities needed for employment in both the public and private sectors, and requires the mastery of at least two European Union languages. It is intended to provide graduates in political science with the specific knowledge needed for employment in key institutions such as: government organizations, institutions related to foreign countries, trade unions and professional organizations. In the workplace graduates perform roles in organizations such as technical and/or professional support, human resource optimization, the management of production processes, and socio-economic relations in fields such as commerce, finance, and insurance.

Course Requirements

To be admitted to the course, applicants must possess the knowledge obtained through a diploma of higher secondary education or other qualifications deemed suitable. Applicants must also demonstrate sufficient written and oral communication skills as well as familiarity with the basic knowledge of general culture. The regulations for the specific course of study outline in more detail the knowledge and skills required and the means used by the faculty to verify that requirements for admission have been met.

Course Objectives

The multidisciplinary approach of the course is structured to ensure that graduates possess knowledge in a variety of disciplines: legal (in the two main branches of public and private law), economic (in the area of political economy), political, sociological and historical - with lessons devoted to contemporary history, the history of political doctrines and general sociology.

The first year study is aimed at acquiring basic knowledge in the key areas listed above. In subsequent years of study the graduate gradually acquires knowledge of public administrations and the complex relationships in the interplay between socio-economic roles in the public and private spheres. Graduates must be fluent in at least two languages.

The learning approaches used to achieve these objectives are standard classroom lectures, supplementary classes, seminars, tutorials and practical professional internships.

Learning will be assessed through oral and/or written exams and a final examination.

Expected Results:

Graduates should be able to:

- Master the basic concepts of political and social science
- State the basic economic concepts of market dynamics
- Describe the historical evolution of policies and institutions
- Understand the legal dynamics involved in governing socio-economic change
- Understand the tools used to intervene in the policies of organizations and institutions
- Discuss how a modern and efficient public administration should work
- Discuss the main problems posed by international community relations

- Describe the development of community and international relations from a historical point of view
- Master techniques that favour an interdisciplinary approach to solving problems posed by social relations
- Master the basic socio-economic and legal concepts related to governing labour markets and geographical territory
- Be able to apply intra- and inter-disciplinary approaches in the design, management and interpretation of data related to social and economic issues
- Possess general and highly interdisciplinary knowledge of the major dynamics found in the workplaces of complex societies, of the relationships between actors in work and production issues, and of consensus and conflict management.

Teaching and Assessment Methods

Traditional teaching methods will be followed. Learning assessment is done through oral and/or written examinations.

Features of the Final Examination

The final exam consists of drafting and discussing a written dissertation on a topic to be agreed on with a professor. It must be accompanied by an abstract in English. The goal of the final exam is to verify the ability of the graduate master a subject from among those covered by the curriculum lessons, and to present and discuss it with clarity.

The final exam counts for 10 CFU. The final exam can be discussed in a foreign language; the same foreign language can be used to draft the written request for the degree and the thesis.

Teaching Schedule

Lessons will be held as follows:

I semester: October – January

II semester: March - June

At the beginning of the academic year the examination dates for each course will be communicated (at least 8 per year).
